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Partnership Opportunities

Our chapter provides a large variety of events that ultimately follows the three pillars of SASE: professional development, community service, and celebrating cultural heritage. We are dedicated to bringing out the sense of community inside our chapter while also promoting and enhancing leadership and professional skills of our members. The following events are some highlights within our chapter.

General Body Meetings (GBMs)

Our general body meetings (GBMs) are bi-weekly events (depending on A&M's calendar) on Tuesday nights at 7:00 PM. During this time, your corporate representative(s) have approximately 45 minutes to present to our members, followed by a Q&A session and additional time to speak to the students individually after the meeting. What to present is of your choosing, such as an overview of your company and its opportunities for the members and/or a professional soft skills workshop.

Professional Development Workshops

As SASE is dedicated to guiding our future generations of industry professionals and leaders, our chapter offers opportunities for companies to provide professional development workshops. These workshops would follow a similar format and guidelines as General Body meetings as company representatives may conduct a workshop of their choice. These workshops may include, but are not limited to, resume reviews, mock interviews, or networking workshops.

Within the previous years, both our general body meetings and professional workshops have averaged around 40 members. General body meetings are offered in person - oftentimes in the Zachary complex or online through zoom. We, however, highly recommend having inperson networking experiences.

involved.






Demographics




SASE National Conference: Each year, SASE hosts the largest Asian American conference and STEM career fair (this year, in Atlanta Georgia) in the United States. Over 3000 top-talent attendees come to attend and learn from over 15 different workshops, attend company tours, and network with recruiters from over 70+ companies. This conference is a great opportunity for students to receive internships or full-time job offers in addition to networking and learn key professional skills. Over the past few years, the number of SASE members receiving internships and full-time offers at the national conference continues to rise. 1. First, navigate to https://www.txamfoundation.com/give.aspx




You should be met with this screen. If not, simply click the "Give Now" button located at the top right of the screen.
